We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Jefferson-Douglass Academy. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

By utilizing evidence-based strategies, teachers can enhance their instructional delivery and engage students more effectively, fostering a positive and productive learning environment.

Moreover, we continue to emphasize the importance of ongoing professional development, akin to our "Get Better Faster" approach. This initiative ensures that teachers receive targeted coaching and constructive feedback, allowing them to refine their practices and better meet the diverse learning needs of our students.

These efforts are part of a comprehensive strategy that includes the analysis and utilization of student performance data. At Cornerstone Jefferson Douglass Academy, we regularly assess this data to identify improvement areas, track student progress, and implement targeted interventions. This data-driven approach guarantees that our resources and support are directed where they are most needed, enabling us to effectively address the individual needs of every student.

Furthermore, Cornerstone Jefferson Douglass Academy deeply values the critical role of parental involvement and community partnerships in fostering student achievement. We actively engage parents through consistent communication, informative workshops, PTO meetings, and a variety of opportunities that encourage their active participation in their child's educational journey.

We are currently in the process of establishing a Community Engagement Board, which will include local businesses, churches, and organizations in our school neighborhood that support our students. This commitment to building robust community partnerships serves to enrich the educational experience by providing additional resources, mentorship programs, and a wide range of enrichment activities. These collaborations not only enhance learning but also create a supportive network that empowers students to thrive both academically and personally.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Our school is a state-funded, public school academy. Therefore, there is no cost to attend the Academy. The school is open to any child wishing to attend. Students must be age-appropriate for their respective grade, and they must reside in the

state of Michigan. By law, the school cannot restrict enrollment based on selection criteria. The school can, however, limit the total number of students who may attend the school. If the number of applications exceeds the number of offered seats, a random selection process will determine who attends the school.
