

Lincoln-King High School 2023-24 School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Lincoln-King High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN ONE OF THESE LABELS'.

Our SAT and MSTEP Science scores declined from 2022-2023, while MSTEP Social Studies showed improvement. With over 90% of students not proficient on MSTEP and SAT, our high school improvement initiatives focus on strengthening MSTEP Science and building on Social Studies gains. We have embedded tutoring into our

block schedule for 9th and 10th grade, successfully bridging learning gaps, and expect continued progress as these students advance to 11th grade. This year, we also introduced an SAT test prep class to build confidence, enhance critical thinking, and improve test-taking skills, particularly in math, reading, and writing, ultimately supporting higher scores and better college opportunities.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Our school is a state-funded, public school academy. Therefore, there is no cost to attend the Academy. The school is open to any child wishing to attend. Students must be age-appropriate for their respective grade, and they must reside in the state of Michigan. By law, the school cannot restrict enrollment based on selection criteria. The school can, however, limit the total number of students who may attend the school. If the number of applications exceeds the number of offered seats, a random selection process will determine who attends the school.

Our School Improvement Plan (SIP) has been accepted by the State of Michigan as a good model for improvement. Via our data-driven SIP we will address our challenges in student achievement/gaps and overall customer satisfaction.

The Andrew J. Young Cornerstone Center for The Complete Life was dedicated at our Lincoln-King Adams-Young auditorium on Grove Street on the very day of the 31st anniversary of the creation of Cornerstone, October 29, 1990. Ambassador Andrew Young joined us and he extended a blessing upon our work for now and for generations to come. The focus of The Center is to prepare us all to live a Complete Life. What is the Complete Life? According to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., it is a life of length, to live for a purpose born; of breadth, to be a person for others; and of height, to know God. As a school, Cornerstone seeks, within the full bounds of our constitutional responsibilities and guidelines, to encourage and make possible such a life for ourselves, our families, and our students. The Complete Life is a virtuous life.
