The 10 Practices are: 1) Deliberate, research-informed efforts to foster literacy, motivation and engagement within and across lessons 2) Read-alouds of age-appropriate books and other materials, print or digital 3) Small group and individual instruction, using a variety of grouping strategies, most often with flexible groups formed and instruction targeted to children's observed and assessed needs in specific aspects of literacy development 4) Activities that build phonological awareness (grades K and 1 and as needed thereafter) 5) Explicit instruction in letter-sound relationships 6) Research-and standards-aligned writing instruction 7) Intentional and ambitious efforts to build vocabulary and content knowledge 8) Abundant reading material and reading opportunities in the classroom 9) Ongoing observation and assessment of children's language and literacy development that informs their education and 10) Collaboration with families in promoting literacy.

Summary: EdTrust defines expanded learning time (ELT) as programs or strategies implemented to increase the amount of instruction and learning students experience. ELT strategies include afterschool, summer, and in-school programs. The evidence suggests that extended learning time programs, including extended school day (ESD), extended school year (ESY), and expanded learning opportunities (ELO) programs that provide academic services during out-of-school time hours, can be effective in improving a range of educational outcomes for students. Findings also suggest that extended learning time programs may be more advantageous for low-income, low-performing, ethnic minority or otherwise disadvantaged students.
